Gender-Responsive Preparedness (GENPAR) Framework

A framework that makes gender a design input to preparedness and response, not an afterthought.

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Brief

Emergencies affect women, men, girls and boys differently, and responses that ignore this are less effective for everyone. The GENPAR framework embeds gender analysis into every stage of the preparedness and response cycle across the MPA countries. It provides a gender-analysis method for risk assessment, standards for sex- and age-disaggregated data, guidance on gender balance and safety in the emergency workforce, and community-engagement approaches that reach women and marginalised groups. The framework is paired with a scorecard so that country plans can be assessed for gender-responsiveness and improvement tracked over time. It connects to the risk-communication and community-engagement innovation portfolio and to the workforce-development competency framework.

Gender analysis in risk assessment

A structured method surfaces differential exposure, vulnerability and access so that risk assessments reflect the whole population.

Disaggregated data standard

Sex- and age-disaggregation is set as a minimum data standard for surveillance and response reporting.

Scorecard

A gender-responsiveness scorecard lets countries assess and improve their plans against clear criteria.
